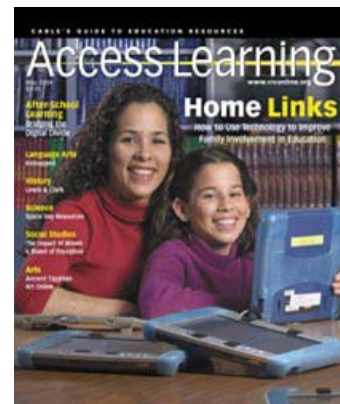

Tours can be customized to specific classroom needs.
